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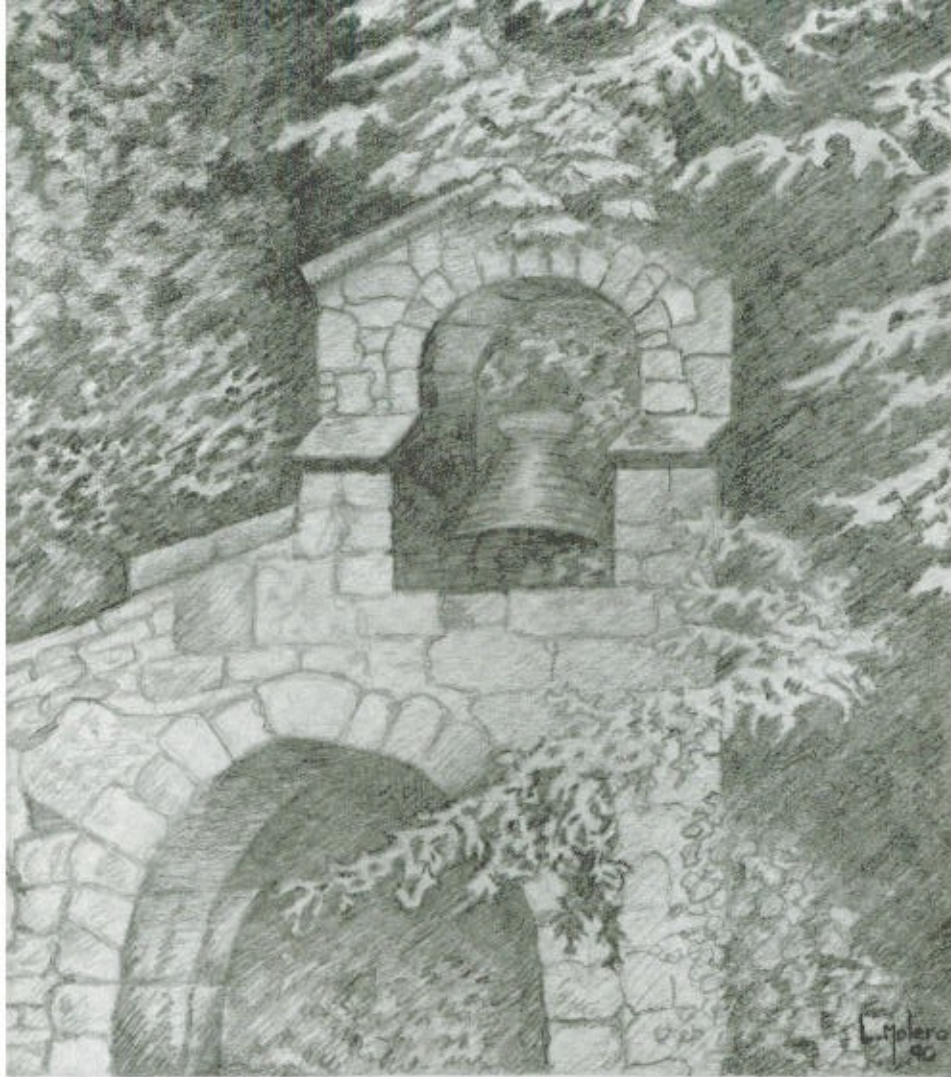

## Mowglis Pack History, 1990

Arrival day of the Eighty-eighth Mowglis season saw a large number of new additions to the camp: boys, staff, and in the physical plant. A new ropes course, a second four-man shell, a new pick-up truck and screens for the dormitories awaited the thirty-nine new and forty-nine returning campers. New to the Senior Staff were Red Cross certification in CPR and First Aid, and the third new Molero sibling in as many years. All the usual opening business took place: On Sunday, fortunately a sunnier day than Saturday, we had our first Chapel ceremony, heights and weights, and picnic supper. We also distributed lending uniforms, selected industries as we heard the cubs firing the cannon, and closed the day with the traditional reading from the *Jungle Book*. Industries started almost immediately the next day and soon the camp was alive with sounds of activity. The rifle range, the unusually well-staffed craft shop and the waterfront were all popular stops; especially so was the last on the hot, humid days which were so common this summer.

On Tuesday, after only one day of industries, the Den left to tackle the mighty Carter-Moriah range, minus Matt Seasonwein, who claimed to have arrived late because of a golf tournament, but those in the know (?) knew it to be a bowling match. The rest of the first week brought us a trivia contest in which Baloo narrowly edged out the Senior Staff as "The Smartest Group in Camp", our first Trip Day and the Den's belated return from their outing — the first in a

long series of trip related problems for Mr. Yamazaki.

By now, we were all thoroughly settled in to the daily routine and the last unfamiliar faces were becoming those of friends. The summer began its usual rapid passage, and we knew that before long, it would be drawing to a close. The second week saw more trips, the July fourth movie and our third annual Independence Day celebration with Camp Onaway on the Seventh of July.

On the trips, we continued to encounter and overcome adversity. Akela conquered Plymouth Mountain by way of the White Footed Mouse Trail, succeeding where Panther had failed the week before, and Mr. Yamazaki managed to drop off not one but two trips late because of a bridge that was reportedly under construction. Even on the few rainy days here and there, we had fun on our trips, and for the most part, the weather was sunny and fine.

The weekend of Friday the Thirteenth was our first visiting weekend, and despite some minor problems with the gas supply, the picnic went off without a hitch, thanks to our feminine neighbors to the south. The name-tags issued before the open industry period seemed to have a mind of their own, recombining with one another, and soon, it was Mr. Juazaki Jyamasohnsukestein who fired the cannon for our guests. In Gray Brother's Hall, we enjoyed once more the pianistic skills of David Master, as well as his artistic ability in making a fine program. And, what Mowglis summer would be

complete without the Hart Bengtson piano duo welcoming the Queen of Sheba and playing for her the ever-popular "Tea for Two"?

Three days later, Mr. Unger arrived to remain an unusually constant denizen of the camp this summer, and we noted that the date of his arrival marked exactly (could it possibly be already?) the midpoint of the summer. As the following weekend was to bring Squad announcements, we began to feel the pressure of time to accomplish our goals for the summer. With Blue and Purple ribbons now offered for instruction, a full range of activities was available, and from the axe yard, craft shop, tennis courts and weather house to the nature room, trip closet, waterfront and rifle range, boys were busily hurrying, trying to accomplish as much as possible. Two brand new ribbons emerged, too: Copper, for Radio, and Aqua (or was that Pink), for Windsurfing.

After the Mow-gee Club made its annual visit to the church in Plymouth, the Squads went out, with fewer boys than usual, and the others started to prepare for the next week's primary activity: Crew. The Glee Club was also in for a surprise, and they added a second stop to their annual summer tour schedule, Mr. Bengtson's church in Laconia.

Before we knew it crew week was upon us. Without the Junior Staff, who were on their trips, things progressed normally, though the Denites found themselves busier than usual. Under the able leadership of Messrs. Antoniuk and Luis Molero, and the fine tutelage of Mr. Don Merrill, Crew Week came to an all-too-hasty conclusion with another Red victory and a particularly warm display of sportsmanship by all.

With the final rush to complete ribbon requirements now upon us, Graduates Dinner, Inner Circle Ceremony, Candleboats, Candelight Service and Mrs. Holt's Day, we mark the close of another Mowglis Season. There are many stories left untold, and many people left to tell them. For more than the events and activities of a Mowglis summer, the biggest part of the season, and indeed of the camp itself, is the people here and their personalities, which cannot adequately be transcribed on paper. Whether it be the mischievous grin of a Cub, the promise

of youth seen in a Denite, the free spirit of the Junior Staff, or the strong character (or sometimes caricature) of the Senior Staff, it is the people who make the place, as much as the place makes the people. It is your record here in the Howl which will be preserved for generations to come, as the generations past have left us their Howls.

As we travel off into the world away from Mowglis with memories of this place, and of these people, we remember that the name "Mowglis" refers not only to the camp, but also to each individual associated with the camp, and we say:
