PACK HISTORY 2014

The summer of 2014 began with the arrival of the counselors in early June, coming together once again on the shores of Newfound Lake, under the massive eastern white pines. Some entered a new home for the first time, while others returned to a familiar one. The group bonded quickly through staff training activities, doing Industries, going on trips, preparing for Industries, setting up dorms, first-aid certification training, learning Gaga Ball, and much more. It was a cold start to the season, with temperatures in the low 40s, and a great lesson learned that you must always be prepared for whatever the White Mountains have to throw at you.

Camper Arrival Day brought boys from seven countries and seventeen states to Mowglis. They were greeted by their counselors, moved into their dorms, took their swim tests, and squeezed in an open period before the first meal of the summer. Opening Day began with a bang, as Toomai fired off the cannon to officially begin the season. There was a very colorful Industries presentation by the instructors at the campfire circle. Campers made their selections, and we were off and running with a normal Sunday afternoon, Chapel, and picnic supper, before getting into the swing of the first Regular Mowglis Day. Soon Akela was off to Nancy Brook. They persevered through a night in which the rainfall must have amounted to 3 inches. Toomai paddled out to Cliff Island and luckily did not experience such wet conditions. Trip Day remained dry, allowing canoes and war canoes to travel across the lake, with the first of many trail-clearing trips to Plymouth Mountain. A bee ended the Den trip early, and the

honor of a visit to the emergency room went to Mr. Crawford. There were first-class evening programs, thanks to Mr. Hart's tall tales, the trip staff's packing skit, Astronomy with Miss Liz, and Mr. Davidge's spring adventure, when he told the boys and staff about how the long road can lead to unexpected surprises, which for him was having dinner with the president of Chile.



After a full week of Industries, requirements were being earned, inspection points began to accumulate, and the Waterfront was one of the busiest places in camp, as one day the water just turned warm, to everyone's delight! The Den was out on the Trail on a new Pack Trip, which was so great that it will be repeated in years to come. Panther avoided the storms as best they could, as they traversed the Franconia Ridge. Baloo experienced a night to remember on Belle Island. Wet and loud, but almost everything stayed dry.

The Mowglis crew boats had been out on the water for several weeks by now. Blisters were calloused and conditioning was beginning to hit a peak. The newly repaired and re-varnished

oars provided a great teachable moment for the boys to learn how and why it's important to properly take care of the equipment—something they were struggling with when it came to keeping track of their personal belongings. The first ribbon of the summer was awarded to Mr. Nunes, who had the



high score at the Rifle Range with a 49 prone, and rain on the days that Mr. Crawford was C.O.D. had become some sort of symbiotic relationship.

The Den was off to the Connecticut Lakes to canoe and try their best to see lots of wildlife in the Great North Woods, even walking across the border into Canada at the northernmost point of the Connecticut River. Toomai camped out and scaled the rock faces of Mt. Cardigan, while Akela took on their first pack trip on the Kinsman Ridge. And yes, Mr. Essich did forget his boots!

Parents arrived for a fun and energetic weekend, taking part in Industries. Everyone gathered in Gray Brothers Hall for an evening of skits, songs, and musical performances by some very talented individuals.

As it often does, week four brought a heat wave for Panther, while they were out in the Mahoosuc Range of New Hampshire and Maine. Both groups enjoyed the Notch, escaped the mud, and all arrived back to camp saying how it was the "best trip ever." With wetness anticipated, many feet of rope, half a dozen tarps, and an extension ladder accompanied Baloo to Waterville Valley to ensure small islands of dry conditions.

A very busy, action-packed, and exciting three-week Cub program awaited the seventeen Cubs, their counselors, and instructors. With an already full Dining Hall, Akela, followed by Panther, helped to test out the Cub Dining Hall prior to the Cubs' arrival. Pantherites and Denites helped to teach the boys how to set tables and all the other duties of the Table Boy.

Squads were off to summit the Presidentials, as both the Gopher and Washington Squads successfully summitted Mt. Washington and experienced the elements that the Presidentials hold.

Everyone was beginning to be anxious about the start of Crew Week. A Third Form would row once again, as Mr. Gulitti had spent countless hours training the boys in proper rowing technique. Some rain and thunder to start the week led to an unusual start, where crew cheers were learned in the morning rather than any rowing actually taking place. All the better for it, under the leadership of Mr. Crawford and Mr. Merwin, the crews got count-offs started earlier than ever, and skits weren't far behind. Sportsmanship and teamwork prevailed as the week cruised on. Spirits were high for the night of the pep rally, crew-shirt presentations, and the bonfire. Race Day brought boys, staff, families, guests, and alumni together on the shores to watch a series of very close and exciting races. In the end, the Blue Racing Crew emerged victorious. The day ended with a delicious cookout on the Ball Field followed by funny and impressive skits and musical talents at Evening Program.



Staff and older campers were shuttled by Mr. Carothers via motorboat to ensure enough strong paddlers could get the Cubs and the boats back to camp safely and in one piece. This was a pristine example of how Mowglis Spirit and Mowglis Men can work through adversity and achieve greatness. Graduates Dinner had a full house, with Graduates from as far back as 1950, and as far away as Mexico City in attendance, all coming together to celebrate and honor the Graduates of 2014. The Inner Circle inducted five new members from Akela and Panther, Candleboats were completed by all boys and staff, and we welcomed parents for the Tennis and Archery Tournament Finals.

Now here we are, after an inspiring and peaceful Candlelight Chapel Service, watching the Candleboats make their way across Sanborn Bay toward Paradise Point. For some, this will be the last time on these shores until next season. Take a moment to reflect on your accomplishments and achievements, your hardships and learning opportunities. Remember that at Mowglis you are always encouraged to do your best, to be kind to one another and the wood folk. As you fall asleep in your bunks tonight, thinking of what it's going to be like living in the next dorm that awaits you, or moving up the ranks to Yearlings, Junior Staff or Senior Staff, remember that it is the person next to you, in front of you, behind you, the person twenty feet away from you, and you yourself that has made this summer so special and rewarding. It is each person's Mowglis Spirit that drives the flow of the summer and unites this community season after season. We hope with all our might that you will continue to live by the Mowglis standards and uphold the Mowglis Spirit in your lives away from camp, and come back next summer with an even better understanding of what it means to be a Mowgli.


