

2002 PACK HISTORY

The pouring rain of opening day 2002 at Mowglis gave way to the most glorious summer weather in Mowglis' history. As the Mowglis Men gathered together to watch the Toomaites shoot off the opening cannon in the lull between raindrops, few would imagine at the time that it would be their last full day of rain for the entire summer.




down through the years as we face the future.

Drama Club




Gopher Squad
