5 TIPS HEADING INTO THE SUMMER:

1. Look at the packing lists now and start to buy stuff a little at a time—there's a lot of stuff boys need. ***Label everything with laundry safe stickers or laundry-safe permanent markers!***
2. Book your weekend accommodations now. If you don't have a favorite B&B yet, there is a new Fairfield Inn in Plymouth (10 minutes from camp), and camp has arranged for a group rate for visiting and crew weekends (visit www.mowglis.org/events to book your room).
3. Make sure to pack plenty of paper and self-addressed envelopes. It is so nice to get a hand written note from your sons! (But be prepared for the notes to be short. "Hi Mom, I'm having a lot of fun and will tell you about it when I get home." is par for the course.) And keep all the correspondence...the boys love it when you embarrass them with the letters many years later.
4. Make sure to sign up to the Facebook feeds that will provide photos and updates. There are three Facebook feeds: one public, one for alumni, and one for families. You need to *friend* Nick Robbins to access the feed for families with all the daily photo updates.
5. Don't forget to fill in those camp forms online (go to www.mowglis.org > Current Families > Log In) The nurse really needs the health information!

WINTER PROJECTS UPDATE

The fun never stops at Camp Mowglis! Mr. Greenwell, Mr. Bengtson, Mr. Merwin and Ms. Donna have been hard at work getting camp ready for summer 2017! The Mowglis “to-do” list seems never-ending, but our team is making great strides and camp is looking great!

GRAY BROTHERS HALL—ROOF

By far our largest building, and certainly one of our most iconic, Gray Brothers Hall found itself in need of a new roof this fall. Thanks to a few very generous alumni, we were able to begin the project this past fall! Local contractors, Dean Rogers and Gary Marsh, who share nearly 25 years of working on projects at Mowglis, managed to complete over 80% of the roof before the snow fell. They laid over 7,000 shingles thus far, and will be back with the spring thaw to complete the last section of roof. Gray Brothers Hall will be ready once again to serve as the central hub of Camp Mowglis!



DEN—WRITING PORCH

All Mowglis alumni know the allure of the Den writing porch. With its commanding view of upper camp, the porch is rarely empty, and often bustling with card games and other shenanigans. The porch was in need of extensive renovation. Mr. Bengtson took on the project this fall, completely rebuilding the foundation around the porch, and replacing the entire deck. Come spring, Mr. B will be wrapping up the railings, and the new porch will be ready for many busy summers to come!

MANG AND CUB APARTMENT

Thanks to a very generous grant, we have taken the opportunity to renovate the interior of both Mang and the Cub Apartment. Both locations are being renovated to more comfortably accommodate staff, and allow for additional occupants. The two locations are home to some of the last remaining plastered walls outside the Jungle House, which as you might guess, can be home to various four-legged visitors. Those will be ripped out, the entirety of the interior will be freshly painted, and plumbing and electrical will be updated.



LOWER MINES

If you had the chance to visit Mowglis this fall, you might have noticed an empty space where the Lower Mines used to be! The building was quite old, and was beginning to not entirely fulfill the needs of such a full camp. Mr. Hart and the senior staff, took on demolishing the old structure at the end of camp last summer. The original foundation was in excellent shape, so the decision was made to build a new Lower Mines, largely modeled after the original, in the same location. Alumnus Woody Merriman was gracious enough to help us design the new and improved building! With financial support from the Walbridge Family Foundation, construction will begin this spring. The new building will be ready for summer 2017 and feature low water use fixtures and a new women’s restroom!


