
To those reading this who will join us as a camper or staff member this summer: SEE YOU SOON!

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ENROLLMENT SNAPSHOT





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Mowglis: An Architectural History 1903-2020 has arrived!



What started as a collaboration with NH preservation historian Elizabeth Hengen to get Mowglis listed on the National Register of Historic Places back in 2014 has, over the last decade, grown into a beautiful 12" x 12" hardcover book that tells the story of Mowglis' development over the last century.

Mowglis: An Architectural History 1903-2020 documents the early days of the School of the Open and follows it as it progresses into the flourishing and thriving institution that has been such a significant part of thousands of people's lives.

The Mowglis campus, which started as the Barnard Family Farm, grew with the program as it developed over the last century; the Campfire Circle was created, the Dorms were built, Gray Brothers was built and then rebuilt, the Jungle House was added onto, a boat house was even pulled across the lake to serve as the core of Waingunga!

Mowglis: An Architectural History 1903-2020 is chock-full of historical photos and stories about the development of the School of the Open. The buildings, the traditions, and the people who brought it all alive are deeply



woven together and documented in this impressive book. From its early roots as the dream of Mrs. Holt to provide a summer school where boys would learn all the important things they were not learning at school to the venerable institution we know today.

The production of this book was no small undertaking. I want to take this opportunity to thank historian Elizabeth Hengen for all her work, as well as the tireless efforts of HEMF Trustee and Chairwoman of our Archive Committee Linda Robinson, as well as Director of Alumni Relations James Hart, and our talented graphic designer Jenn Libby, as well as numerous members of the Archive and Publications Committees. To all who helped bring Mowglis: An Architectural History 1903-2020 to fruition, I raise a Mowglis Cheer!

DEN REUNION: 1973


2023 marks the 50th reunion for the **Den of 1973** and we are excited to welcome this crew

This year we made a significant investment in Mowglis' fleet and purchased three additional vans.

These two fifteen-passenger and one twelvepassenger vans will make Trip Days, airport pickups, and shuttle runs safer, simpler, and convenient!


